Alon Confino, Paul Betts, and Dirk Schumann, eds., Between Mass Death and Individual Loss: the Place of the Dead in Twentieth-Century Germany [New York: Berghahn Books, 2008]

In his fascinating account of Thessalonica's history, Mark Mazower observed that up to the Great War the dead and the living literally shared the same space. The city's citizens lived and worked among and on top of graves. Beginning in late nineteenth century however, Mazower writes, "the dead and the living began to move apart." This was, as Philip Ari s and others have noted, the situation all over Europe. In the name of hygiene and new "modern" bourgeois sensibilities, the dead and the living steadily separated. World War II, however, suddenly and dramatically brought death and the dead back into view. Germany stood at the center of this "return of the dead." Indeed, death and Germany, the editors of Between Mass Death and Individual Loss suggest, stood in a very intimate relationship in the last century. This excellent collection of essays, which came out of a conference in the University of Virginia in Charlottesville in the fall of 2003, set out to examine the relationship between death and Germany across the last century with a particular emphasis on the moment in 1945 when death came to Germany.

In their introduction, the editors rightly argue for a look beyond the over-concentration on the world wars. Historians should look at the impact of mass death in the contexts of the longer social history of individual death in the twentieth history, connecting mass death in wars with
